Parks & Recreation provides recreational and leisure opportunities for people who experience a disability.

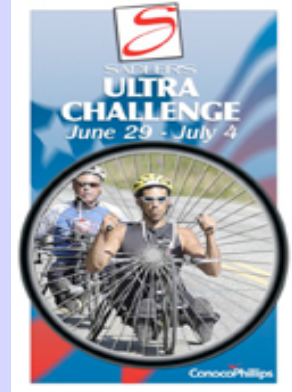
We offer year round recreation opportunities such as:

Our programs are designed to help people expand their horizons, master new skills, make new friends, and increase motor coordination. Most importantly, participants experience growth in self-confidence and independence that affects all aspects of an individual's life. Our services are open to all, regardless of type of disability or age. Our one-to-one ratio allows us to meet individual needs and abilities. Our goal is to help others reach their full potential.

Alpine Alternatives has 3 Camps this summer:

* **Camp Alpine I:** June 25-30: (ADD/ADHD) Campers must be totally independent, ambulatory, learning disabled, ADD/ADHD or any other comparatively mild disability. Campers will be very physically active and must be able to hike up to 2 miles at a steady pace & participate in other sports-related activities. Ages 7-25

* **Camp Alpine II:** July 23-27: (Partial Assistance) This camp is for individuals who experience developmental disabilities, behavior challenges, mental challenges or those who need partial/minimal assistance with daily needs. AA does not provide one-on-one behavioral support. Campers must bring their own support person if the behaviors warrant such. Ages 7-25

* **Camp Alpine III:** August 1-6: (Inclusion) This camp is for individuals who experience a disability, their siblings and/or friends. Individuals who experience physical challenges, moderate mental challenges and are non-ambulatory or have sensory impairments are welcome at this camp. Ages 7-25

Day Outings: 26 Outings are planned for this summer which include: Campbell Creek Science Center, Reindeer Farm; AD Wildlife Conservation Center. the Musk Ox Farm, Pyrah's U Pick Farm, Kulis National Guard Base tour, and many parks and hikes.

Horseback Riding: Alpine Alternatives provides 3 sessions of horseback riding. Wednesdays horseback riding takes place at Pt McKenzie outside Wasilla and the Monday sessions take place at Peter's Creek Horse Park.

Summer programs fill up quickly so call to find out costs and availability.

Blaze Sports Alaska Your input is needed!

The Anchorage School District is excited to partner with Challenge Alaska to bring the Blaze Sports Program to Alaska. Blaze Sports provides sporting opportunities for people with physical disabilities comparable to those provided for non-disabled persons. This program is forming right now in Alaska and your valuable input will help in its design. Open to athletes able to learn and follow rules to games independently and fall into one of these classifications: spinal cord injury, visual impairments, amputations, polio, spina bifida, neuro-muscular, and other (dwarfism, orthopedic impairment, etc.)

Athletics that might be available include: Wheelchair tennis, Wheelchair basketball, Goalball (for visually impaired), Track & field, Wheelchair power soccer, Swimming, Cycling, Skiing, Sled Hockey, Sitting Volleyball.

Anchorage School District Summer School 2006 for High School

Summer school is open to Anchorage School District high school students in grades 8 through 12. Summer School students include those who have a failing course grade, or did not pass any portion of the High School Graduation Qualifying Exam (HSGQE), or students who wish to take a course to get ahead or free up their schedule for more electives in the Fall.

Dates:

Last day to preregister: June 8th
Summer school registration: June 19th
1st Day of Summer School: June 21st
Summer school Holiday: July 3 & 4
Last Day of Summer School: July 28th

Summer School Sites: Bartlett, Dimond, Eagle River, East, West, King Career Center, SAVE

Classes:

High school courses in social studies, mathematics, language arts, physical education, science, job co-op, art, and electives are offered. Complete course lists appear on the summer school registration form. It is possible to earn 1/2 credit for each summer school course; in some instances, you may be able to complete 2 courses during the summer.

Fees: \$75 for each class. A parent may apply for a fee waiver or deferred tuition due to an economic hardship. (This application can be obtained at the school.)
